2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.		<p>At the outset of semester, academic calendar is prepared. For the completion of syllabus every department adopts conventional methods of chalk and board along with different innovative teaching pedagogies like flipped class rooms, collaborative learning, critical-thinking and problem-solving skills, project-based learning and various other teaching methods like assignments, demonstration, PPT presentations, industrial visits, field tours, class test, chart, models and case study to make the teaching learning process more learner-centric. To complete the syllabus in stipulated time, the teachers are always motivated to make use of different animation sites, educational databases. The platforms like zoom, google meet are being used, especially in the pandemic situation like Covid-19 outbreak. Guest lectures of experts from various fields like industry, private organizations, research institutes, are arranged to make students understand the concepts with variety of examples and explanations. Freedom of selection of teaching course is given to teachers according to their expertise so that all the teachers could deliver their course content effectively. All the teachers maintain an academic diary for effective academic planning, implementation and review of the curriculum. Throughout the semester, details such as lecture plan, timetable, students' attendance records, teachers' manual, curriculum book, resources used, contents beyond the syllabus and other details are entered in this record book by a faculty member. Regular syllabus coverage review is taken by academic monitoring committee (AMC).</p> <p>At the beginning of semester, identification of slow and advanced learners is made through a general aptitude test. The remedial classes are arranged for slow and advanced learners to improve their academic performance and increase their inclusion in educational process. To bridge the gap between slow and advanced learners bridge courses are run. Extra lectures are organised for such students. Guest lectures are organised to increase interest of students in learning. Advanced learners are motivated for competitive exams such as IIT-JAM, DBT, TIFR etc. They are provided with additional study material too. We also provide several facilities to develop their knowledge and skills. They are deputed to attend the University, State and National level Seminars /Workshops conducted in their subjects. So that they get acquainted with the advancements in their subjects. The institute conducted various student centric activities throughout the year so that learning became more experimental, participatory, and socialistic by organizing activities like Group discussion, field visit, debate, seminar, and workshop. Institute adopted Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) System to assess student's academic performance. Students counselling committee constantly interact with the students and guide them about opportunities in career as well as to cope up with exam fear. Institute also implemented mentor mentee scheme for the interaction between senior and junior students. Mentors are promoted to teach some of the part of curricula to slow learners so that the mentors will get motivation and slow learners will feel more comfortable to learn the basics from their peers.</p>
